Giving alms should be a sacrificial act if it has any worth. One cannot give merely what is left over when all his or her own needs are satisfied. One must take from oneself and give to others. In the spiritual tradition of the Church, it is the teaching that what one saves through fasting and abstinence (for example, during the special Lenten season) should not be kept for other times but should be given away to the poor.


