VENMO CHANGES

We had to make some changes to our Venmo account for potential tax implications on a personal Venmo account and created a non-profit charity Venmo account. Unfortunately, this does mean changes for you when using Venmo.

- 1. You will need to search the new Venmo charity profile using the instructions below.
 - \Rightarrow Log in to the Venmo app.
 - ⇒ Click "pay/request"
 - ⇒ Type in St-NicholasGR
 - ⇒ Scroll under "Charities"
 - ⇒ Look for our profile (the picture is the Nave of our church)
- 2. Venmo will take out 1.9% + \$0.10 for every transaction. This means the church will only be receiving your donation minus 1.9% + \$0.10 per transaction (and that is what will show up on your statement). If you want the church to receive the full amount, please add the additional amount to your donation.


