JOURNEYING TO PASCHA

REJOICING ON PALM SUNDAY (NEXT SUNDAY)

On the Sunday before the Feast of Great and Holy Pascha and at the beginning of Holy Week, the Orthodox Church celebrates one of its most joyous feasts of the year. Palm Sunday is the commemoration of the Entrance of our Lord into Jerusalem following His glorious miracle of raising Lazarus from the dead. Having anticipated His arrival and having heard of the miracle, the people went out to meet the Lord and welcomed Him with displays of honor and shouts of praise. On this day, we receive and worship Christ in this same manner, acknowledging Him as our King and Lord.

 - Holy Thursday Foot Washing
 - Prayer Vigil following Good Friday Lamentations service until the Holy Saturday morning service.
 - Read the Gospel in another language @ Agape Vespers

OUR YOUNGEST MEMBERS

We desire that our children participate in worship. This takes training and patience. Remember...

<u>The best seats</u>: Children can learn and participate the best when they can see. Consider sitting in the front of the nave.

<u>Food in Church</u>: Infants and toddlers may have a tidy snack in the pews, but kids 5 and up can learn to make it through service just fine, especially with a bite in the car before coming in.

<u>Books are best</u>: Please do your best to leave toys in the car.

Know when to fold 'em: Sometimes a child can't be quieted, and that's OK – but for the sake of others, don't feel bad about taking them out to the Cry Room.

<u>Moving around</u>: Kids are quick, but young children should not leave the pews on their own.

<u>Blessed Bread</u>: Assist your children in only taking 1 piece of antidoron (Blessed Bread).
